LIEUTENANT COLONEL MATTHEW E. **TIPTON**

Lieutenant Colonel Matthew E. Tipton is the Director, Air Force Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps, Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. He is responsible for the Air Force's high school citizenship training program comprised of about 85,000 students and 1,600 instructors at approximately 850 high schools worldwide. Lieutenant Colonel Tipton directs staff initiatives and policy to implement the world's largest and most comprehensive aerospace science education program.

Lieutenant Colonel Tipton received his commission in 2003 through the Air Force Reserve Officers' Training Corps at the University of Alabama. After graduating from Combat Systems Officer Training at Randolph AFB, he was assigned as an electronic warfare officer to the EC-130H COMPASS CALL. In 2010 he was assigned to the 561st Joint Tactics Squadron where he worked advanced integration tactics, techniques, and procedures. In 2016, Lieutenant Colonel Tipton was assigned as the military advisor to the Office of Security and Human Rights, U.S. Department of State, where he oversaw security force assistance human rights vetting requests. Following this he was the director of operations for the Air Force's only EC-130H formal training



unit and later commanded the 362d Recruiting Squadron. Prior to his current assignment, Lieutenant Colonel Tipton served as the Deputy Director for Strategy and Concepts at the LeMay Center for Doctrine Development.

Lieutenant Colonel Tipton is a senior navigator. He is married to Lindsay, and they have three awesome children: Duke, Laurel, and Cade.
