DUSTIN E. LAWRENCE

Mr. Dustin E. Lawrence is an Instructional Systems Design professional at the Air Force Negotiation Center, Maxwell, Air Force Base, Alabama. In this position, he is charged with course development, including project management and process improvement activities, performing instructor duties to Air Force Negotiation Center audiences, conducting research, coordination, and development efforts required of a course design phase, developing test programs before fielding new products, producing Sharable Content Object Reference Model compliant products to be delivered on multiple cyber-based platforms, as well as formatting and loading products appropriately for use on Learning Management Systems.

Mr. Lawrence served in the Air Force beginning in 1998. Initially as an Air Traffic Controller, he provided aerospace direction for the Air Force's busiest Air Traffic Control Center for nearly three years, until latter 2000. He then cross-trained into the Satellite and Wideband Communications career field, which took him to seven different assignments, all seven continents, and fifty-seven countries over the course of the next 14 years. He has an advanced electrical engineering background which allowed him to develop and field unmanned aerial vehicles, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration weather balloons, Air Force space systems, lightweight man-pack communications systems, and many others, culminating as Superintendent of North Atlantic Treaty Organization



and Air Force owned nuclear assets. Which further included his leadership and direction of the Air Force's only Nuclear University, where he designed, developed, and instructed coursework for training and utilization of all Air Force overseas assigned nuclear weapons security maintenance personnel while supervising and leading eighteen instructors.

In 2014, Mr. Lawrence took on a career broadening opportunity, becoming a First Sergeant. Where he served for five years at Ramstein Air Base, Germany leading, mentoring, and influencing, 47-thousand service members and their families while assigned to multiple squadrons and detachments. In 2019, he volunteered for assignment to the Air Force First Sergeant Academy, Maxwell-Gunter, Air Force Base, Alabama. serving as Instructor and Director of Education for more than eight-hundred students annually. As well as becoming a Alternate Dispute Resolution Facilitator and Instructor. He served at the First Sergeant Academy for Air University until 2021, when he retired after 23 years of service. In latter 2020, while still on active duty until latter 2023, Mr. Lawrence opened Provisions Cheese and Wine Shoppe, which became the largest cheese shop in Alabama, and was listed on the Top-100 fastest growing businesses in Alabama. However, wanting to get back to educating and instructing, in latter 2023 he sold his portion of ownership to friends and came back to Air University after a year-break to care for family. Mr. Lawrence started as a contractor with C2 Technologies partnered with Air University in June of 2024.
